

## Finding a MAC Address: Quick Guide

Before any other step check the actual device as many portable devices have the wireless MAC address printed on the device itself or as a label.

### Finding the MAC address on a Sony Clie

1. Goto the System Preferences (Prefs)
2. Choose Network from the pull down menu, then select the Details... button
3. Press the menu pull down button and select Connection Status.
4. The MAC address is listed. The format is nn:nn:nn:nn:nn:nn, where n is a hexadecimal digit (0-9 and A-F)

**Note:** The 0's are ZEROS not letter O's.

### Finding the MAC address on a Palm Tungsten C

1. From the Home screen, tap **Prefs**.
2. Under Communication, tap **WiFi**.
3. At the bottom of the WiFi
4. Preferences screen, tap **Info**.
5. You'll find the MAC address of the device listed on the third line of the screen. The format is nn:nn:nn:nn:nn:nn, where n is a hexadecimal digit (0-9 and A-F).
6. Tap **Done** twice to return to the Preferences main screen.

**Note:** The 0's are ZEROS not letter O's.

### Finding your MAC address on a PocketPC 2002 or Windows Mobile 2003

1. From the Start Menu, tap **Settings**, then the **System** tab.
2. Locate and tap the icon that either lists your PDA's hardware components or manages the wireless network component.

**Note:** On the Toshiba e750 series, click **Wireless LAN Manager**. On the Dell Axim, click **Dell WLAN Utility**

(it is on the **Connections** tab, not the **System** tab). On a Hewlett Packard (HP) iPaq, tap **Asset Viewer**.

3. Locate the setting, tab, or dialog box that reveals the MAC address:

· **Toshiba e Series PocketPC:** In the Wireless LAN Manager, select **Info**. You'll find the MAC address

listed at the top of this screen.

· **Dell Axim:** For the X30 models, in the Dell WLAN Utility, select **Advanced**. Then, tap **Network**

**Troubleshooting**, and then **Advanced**. For the X3i models, in the Dell WLAN Utility under "Station IP

Info", tap **More Info**. The MAC address is one of the bottom two items.



· **HP iPaq:** In the Asset Viewer, tap + (the plus sign) next to "Wireless LAN". The MAC address will be one of the details listed.

### **Finding your MAC address on a Blackberry**

1. Press menu at the home screen.
2. Select Options.
3. Select Status.
4. Select WLAN MAC address.

### **Finding your MAC address on a iPhone and iPod Touch**

1. Select Settings
2. Select General
3. Select About
4. Scroll down to "Wi-Fi address". The MAC address is listed there.

### **Finding your MAC address on a Windows Mobile 5 and 6**

1. Select Start
2. Select Settings
3. Select Connections
4. Select Wireless LAN
5. Select Advanced.

**Note:** Wifi must be switched on to see the MAC address.

### **Finding your MAC address on a Macintosh Running OSX**

Open 'System Preferences' (usually found in the Dock) and select Network. Pick a location and specify the interface whose MAC address is desired in the Show: drop down list. For wireless, select 'Airport' in the Show: dialog. Read the MAC address labeled 'Airport ID:'.

### **Finding your MAC address in Windows 98/2000/XP/Vista**

Run **ipconfig/all** from a Command Prompt window.

(click **Start**, then **Run**, then type cmd in the text box. In Vista, click in the search box and type in **Command Prompt**. Click the **Command Prompt** program.)

Type in **ipconfig/all** in the Command Prompt Windows.

The 12-digit Physical Address for the wireless interface is the same as MAC address
